

CSI Effect: Does It Deter? By: Madison Casey and Dr. Timothy Wilson





Hypothesis:

Ha1: An increased amount of time viewing crime-show dramas, will lead to an increased perception of forensic science knowledge.

Ha2: An increased amount of time viewing crime-show dramas, will lead to an increase in crime deterrence.

Findings: (93 Respondents)

- -- High correlation between watching and reporting
- -- Watching at all had a high correlation, but watching once a week was highest
- -- Gender did not affect response
 - -- 3:1 ratio males
 - -- 2:1 ratio females
- -- Age had not affect. Positive response from all ages
- No difference between crime show drama and crime show documentary
 Both positive
